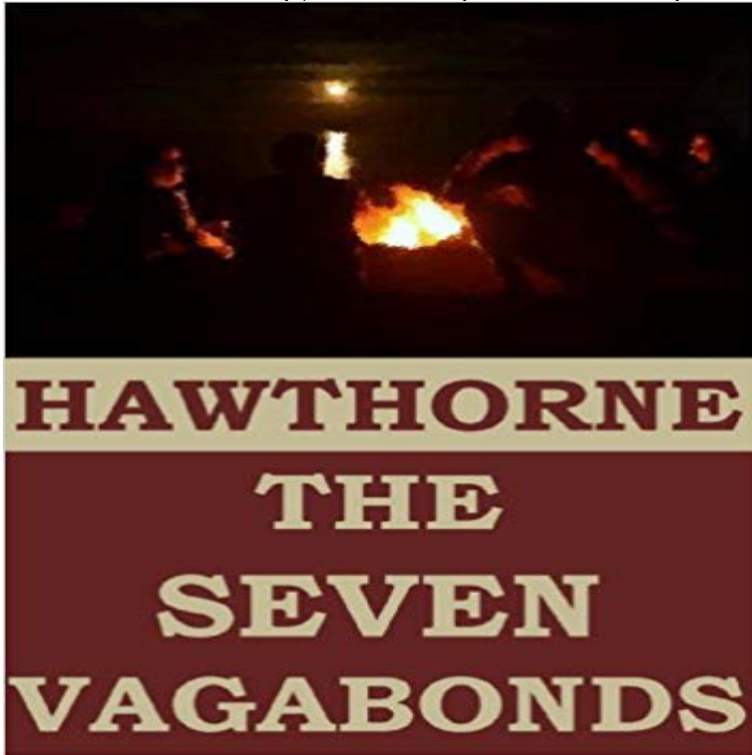


The Seven Vagabonds (Annotated)
