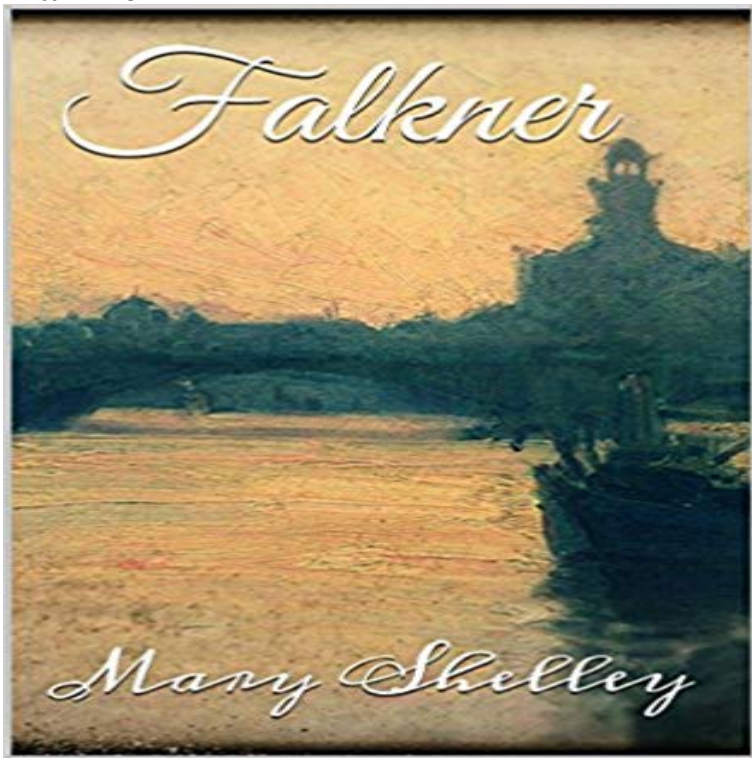


## Falkner
