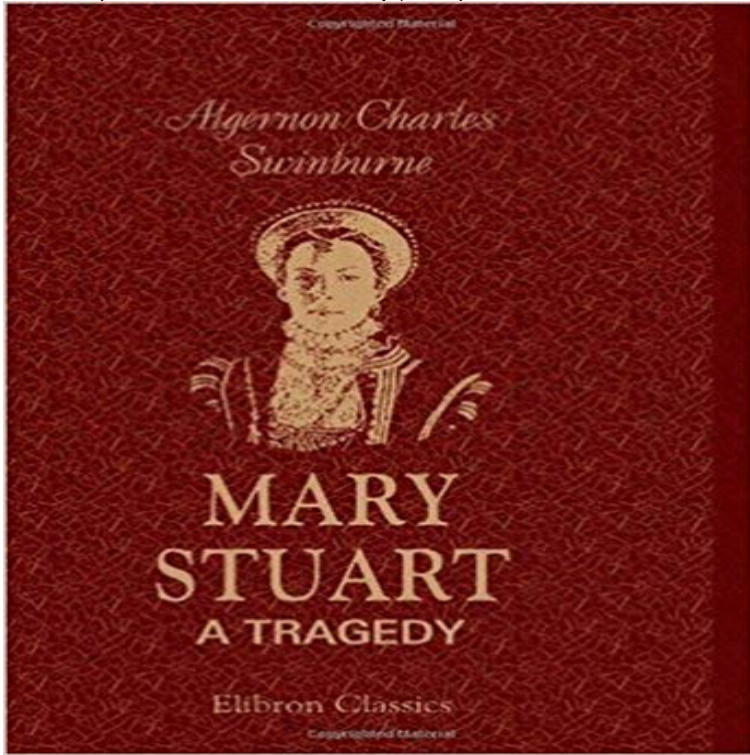


Mary Stuart: A Tragedy
