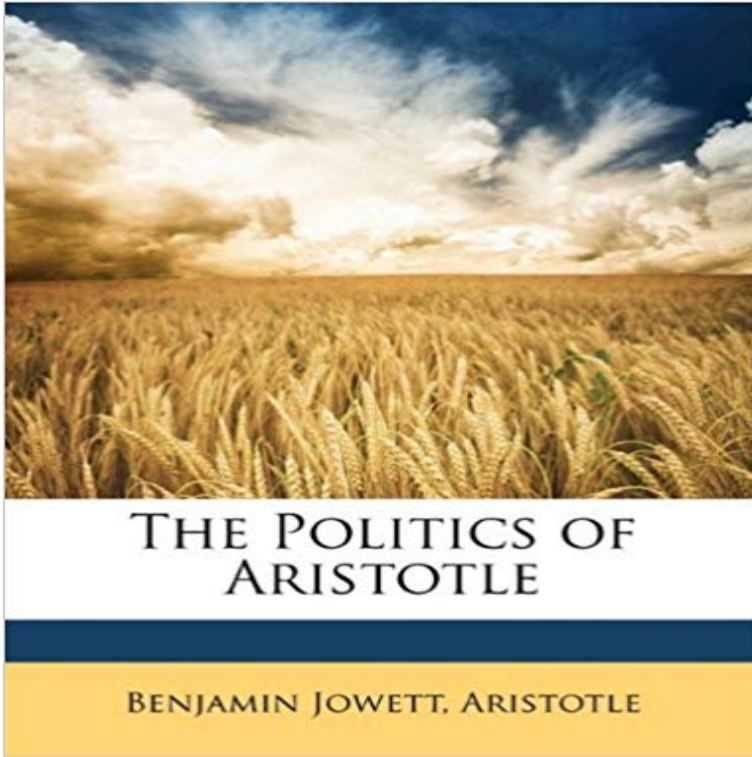


# The Politics of Aristotle
